

NOTES ON THE WAR MEMORIAL, LIMEKILNS AND CHARLESTOWN

33 names are carved into the stone which, according to the Imperial War Museum's War Memorials Archive, came from Cullaloe, near Dalgety Bay.

The memorial was designed by Col. the Hon. David Bruce, (1888-1964., uncle of the then Earl of Elgin), and made by Messrs. James Stewart & Sons of Dunfermline. The memorial was unveiled by the Earl of Elgin on 13 November 1921.

Definition of a war memorial

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission consider a war memorial to be any tangible object which has been erected or dedicated to commemorate those killed as a result of war, conflict or peacekeeping; who served in war or conflict; or who died while engaged in military service.

This includes memorials to civilians and animals. It also includes memorials to those who died in service as a result of accident or disease. It does not include gravestones which are situated on the site of burial of the casualty, but it does include additions to gravestones which commemorate a casualty buried elsewhere. The CWGC also record peace and thanksgiving memorials.

To be **erected or dedicated** there must be, or have been, some clear statement, such as the wording on the memorial, in a printed document, in a newspaper announcement or similar, that defines the commemorative purpose of the feature and reports its erection. A formal unveiling ceremony need not have taken place, although these are very common.

Conflict includes civil wars, rebellion and acts of terrorism whether or not war was formally declared.

Military service refers to all the armed forces. The commemoration can refer to service during war or conflict or service during peacetime. Commemorations of those who died in service as a result of accident or disease are included, as are commemorations of those who died after the end of the conflict as a result of wounds or of the affects of war. The commemoration can refer to the death, war service, or return home of those who served.

Civilians whose death occurred as a consequence of war or conflict are included. This includes those who died as a result of enemy action or in a war related accident, eg: from an air raid or an explosion in a munitions factory. Civilians who served in wartime non-combatant services are included, e.g. Merchant Marine Service, Red Cross, Home Guard, Air Raid Wardens, Fire Watchers and similar groups involved with a war effort.

Commemorations of **animals** which were killed, or gave assistance or companionship, in war or conflict are included.

A casualty therefore includes military personnel, refugees, civilians and animals.

"During the operations at the Apex"—near Bullecourt—"between the 12th and 16th December 1917, this N.C.O, whilst in charge of a bombing squad showed great gallantry and devotion to duty. He inflicted heavy casualties on the enemy and compelled him to retire. Even after he had been wounded he continued to direct his squad and was only compelled to give over his command owing to his complete exhaustion." He was mortally wounded less than three weeks afterwards, and the Medal was posthumously presented to his father, Mr Andrew Skinner, Halkettshall, Limekilns. [Pl. 2].

One of the first repatriated prisoners from Penrith to reach home is Pte Percy Scott, oldest son of Mr and Mrs William Scott, Ingleside, Penrith, who arrived home on Tuesday night and

recieved a warm welcome from his family and friends.

Private Scott joined the Westmorland and Cumberland Yeomanry in 1914 when only 16 years of age and acted as regimental bugler, later passing into the band while stationed at Cupar.

On reaching military age he passed into the Border Regiment and was sent to France. He was taken prisoner on 27th May this year (1918), at the time he was doing R.A.M.C work.

He was captured while helping a wounded Corporal whom he refused to leave.

Private Scott is a modest and unassuming young man and not given to exaggeration and his story of how the Germans treated their prisoners has thus a added value. Private Scott was captured by a German machine gun squad while helping his patient through the French village of Rucy? in the Soissons district and was at once stripped of his watch, Knife, haversack and dressing case. He was then marched to a recieving cage behind the enemy lines, he and other prisoners were kept there a week and were compelled to assist in putting down a light railway.

These prisoners behind the lines were the worst treated for they were beyond the kindly reaches of the prisoner of war committees; they were disgracfully fed and had to work under the constant risks of our own artillery fire. As soon as the rails were laid the British guns blew them to smithereens and the work had all to be begun again. During the week that Pte Scott was there he recieved one meal of flour and water on his first day, and this had to be drunk out of his steel helmet for the next two days he got nothing but the next day the flour and water ration was repeated.

After the week had elapsed Pte Scott was sent to Lappion to work in a German hospital as a stretcher bearer, the hospital was a church and the wounded - German, French and British were

brought there in trucks. The doctors there were fairly decent but they were handicapped by the lack of surgical appliances, anaesthetics and bandages, these latter and the towels were

made of paper and when saturated were of little use. After a week there he was moved on to $Hirson, \ldots$

on the morning of the armestice, the 70 British and 80 French prisoners were marched to Friedrichsfeld, 35 kilometers by road, thence to Wesel, where they entrained for Zevenaar in Holland, had a triumphal march through Rotterdamand so home to " Blighty ".

Census 1901 shows the family still living at South Row Charlestown, and James has an older brother William born 1893 at Charlestown, and a younger sister Euphemia, also born at Charlestown, who was only 8 months old at the time. The Census shows that mother Esther was born at Leith, which would explain why they married there.

At the time of Census 1911 the whole family is still at South Row. Eldest son William (18) is a Railway Labourer at Rosyth Naval Base; James is a Tenter in a linen factory; Euphemia (10) and another younger sister Elizabeth (5) are listed as scholars.

Census 1911 also shows that Robert and Esther had had 5 children, but only 4 were surviving.

One minor anomaly between Census 1901 and Census 1911 is that Robert Wilson states his place of birth as Dunfermline and in the latter census as Charlestown.

The valuation roll for 1915 shows that Robert Wilson is still resident at South Row.

Wimereux is a small town situated approximately 5 kilometres north of Boulogne.

From the centre of Boulogne take the A16 to Calais and exit at junction 33. Follow the D242 into Wimereux and at the first roundabout in town, take the third exit, continuing on the D242 and after approximately 200 yards, turn left into a one way road. The Cemetery lies at the end of this road.

The Commonwealth War Graves are situated to the rear of the Communal Cemetery. Because of the sandy nature of the soil, the headstones lie flat upon the graves.

Historical Information

Wimereux was the headquarters of the Queen Mary's Army Auxiliary Corps during the First World War and in 1919 it became the General Headquarters of the British Army.

From October 1914 onwards, Boulogne and Wimereux formed an important hospital centre and until June 1918, the medical units at Wimereux used the communal cemetery for burials, the south-eastern half having been set aside for Commonwealth graves, although a few burial were also made among the civilian graves. By June 1918, this half of the cemetery was filled, and subsequent burials from the hospitals at Wimereux were made in the new military cemetery at Terlincthun.

During the Second World War, British Rear Headquarters moved from Boulogne to Wimereux for a few days in May 1940, prior to the evacuation of the British Expeditionary Force from Dunkirk. Thereafter, Wimereux was in German hands and the German Naval Headquarters were situated on the northern side of the town. After D-Day, as Allied forces moved northwards, the town was shelled from Cap Griz-Nez, and was re-taken by the Canadian 1st Army on 22 September 1944.

Wimereux Communal Cemetery contains 2,847, Commonwealth burials of the First World War, two of them unidentified. Buried among them is Lt.-Col. John McCrae, author of the poem "In Flanders Fields." There are also five French and a plot of 170 German war graves.

The cemetery also contains 14 Second World War burials, six of them unidentified.

The Commonwealth section was designed by Charles Holden.

Aubigny-en-Artois is a village approximately 15 Kms north-west of Arras on the road (N39) to St. Pol.

From the N39 turn onto the D75 towards the village of Aubigny-en-Artois. The Cemetery lies south on a road leading from the centre of the village, and the Extension is behind it.

Historical Information

Before March, 1916, Aubigny was in the area of the French Tenth Army, and 327 French soldiers were buried in the Extension to the West of what is now Plot IV. From March 1916 to the Armistice, Aubigny was held by Commonwealth troops and burials were made in the Extension until September 1918. The 42nd Casualty Clearing Station buried in it during the whole period, the 30th in 1916 and 1917, the 24th and 1st Canadian in 1917 (during the capture of Vimy Ridge by the Canadian Corps) and the 57th in 1918.

The Extension now contains 2,771 Commonwealth burials of the First World War and seven from the Second World War. There are also 227 French burials made prior to March 1916, and 64 German war graves.

The Extension was designed by Sir Reginald Blomfield.



Andrew Simpson Ferguson, as per his birth registration, was born on 11 - 5 - 1893 at Limekilns, the illegitimate son of Catherine Ferguson, a housekeeper.

Six months later, Andrew Simpson Ferguson was legitimised (birth record has a register of Corrected Entry) as his parents Catherine Ferguson and George M. Simpson, Merchant Seaman, married on 2 - 11 - 1993 at Limekilns. It is presumed that George and Catherine were caught short in a moment of passion and George was away at sea whilst Catherine was pregnant and gave birth to Andrew.

In Census 1901, she is entered as Kate Simpson, wife of a Master Mariner, and with her son Andrew now 7 years old, they were living at Main Street, Limekilns.

It is presumed that George Simpson was away at sea at the time of the Census.

Catherine Ferguson was the daughter of John Ferguson, Merchant Seaman, and Amelia Muir. George Simpson was the son of Andrew Simpson , Merchant Seaman, and Christine Mercer (deceased at the time of this marriage).

The previous page of the Census 1901 on which Catherine Ferguson and son Andrew are entered, there is some additional family information.

Catherine Ferguson's mother Amelia Muir, now a widow and being 'kept by family', is living at Oriel House in Academy Square. Also living in Oriel House are John Ferguson and Amelia Ferguson, Catherine's siblings.

The same Census page also shows a family called Mercer with Helen Mercer, widow, as the head, and various sons and daughters. Helen Mercer, living on means, has 7 children at home, four of whom are scholars. Needs investigated to see the Mercer connection

P2 also shows a White family - are these the ones we are also interested in????

Catherine Ferguson died on 7 - 4 - 1933, aged 63, and is buried at Rosyth Churchyard. Her headstone, shown later, also commemorated her son Andrew F Simpson who, aged 21, drowned on 28 - 8 - 1914 at Leningrad where he is interred. It also commemorates another son John who died in infancy.

George Mercer Simpson died on 24 - 9 - 1951, aged 84, and is buried at Douglas Bank Cemetery. His headstone, shown later, includes details of wife, Catherine Ferguson.



"An image of Skinningrove Jetty with SS Hummersea moored up for loading, with two steam cranes in attendance, either just before or just after high-tide – judging by the marks on the jetty wall. Even more rare is the vertical-boilered railway engine (known as "the coffee pot") on the left with the train of pig-iron trucks – we've never seen an image with these on before, or with a vertical-boilered railway engine. The pig-iron trucks were lowered from (and raised to) the works via a rope incline down Jetty Bank – a feature still visible to this day. SS Hummersea looks pristine – we wonder if this was her first trip?

Her last according to the Commonwealth War Graves Commission was during World War I, when it was believed she struck a mine and sank. Charles Hannaford advises us: "My great uncle, Charles F Hannaford, was the Master of the S.S.Hummersea. The ship was lost in December 1915, probably by an enemy mine as my uncle died from his wounds in naval hospital, London on 30th December 1915 and listed as a casualty of war. As the wounds were unlikely to have been caused through the ship foundering in the bad weather and the submarine activity at the time was low, a mine is the most logical explanation."

As . . . pointed out, Hummersea is a missing vessel.

The CWGC and RN have been fairly generous when it comes to the crews of missing ships, with the general presumption apparently being that if a ship disappeared, it was likely because of war-related causes (torpedo, mine, etc.) even if no specific event has been linked with sinking the vessel.

I don't know what happened to Hummersea. There's not a lot of U-boat activity at that time, so that isn't the answer. A mine is always possible but in my estimation the most likely cause of loss is weather. The weather was absolutely horrible on December 31, 1915 and January 1, 1916 and a number of other ships disappeared at this time:

.... It just occurred to me that as this ship was not lost due to enemy action, it may have an entry in the Wreck Reports held at Southampton Libraries.

Here's what Southampton Library had to say about the SS Hummersea:

"Our file of inquiry reports do not include one on the loss of the Hummersea. She is listed in the Board of Trade returns in the section on missing vessels but with little more detail than you already have. According to this entry, she was 18 years, a steel steam ship, carrying a cargo of pig iron. The Hummersea was not heard of since sailing from Middlesbrough for Caen on 29 December 1915.

12 lives were lost. Lloyd's Register of Shipping returns for 1916 also list the Hummersea's loss under the heading of missing vessels."

Introduction and Assumptions

and with no other information, and such a common name for birth marriage and death records, it was initially very difficult to locate the desired person.

The only Merchant Navy Engineer David Wilson listed by the Commonwealth War Graves states:-

In Memory of

Second Engineer

David Wilson

"Hummersea" (Middlesborough) Mercantile Marine who died 30th December 1916

There is a almost no information concerning the fate of the Hummersea. From information posted online, as shown later, it is believed that the ship sailed from Middlesborough bound for Caen, and was probably sunk after striking a mine. During WWI, from the time of the first action when German surface ships shelled Scarborough and Whitby, the Germans placed hundreds of mines in several locations off the east coast of England, and as a result numerous ships were lost in these waters.

There is a strange report that the Captain of the Hummersea died of his wounds in a London hospital, and the date referenced is 1915, a year different from that used by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission. Somehow they knew this man was the captain of the Hummersea, yet no other information concerning its fate or location.

However, using an assumed age range for an expected chief engineer, and analysing many Census entries, the range was reduced, and then a likely candidate was found who had been born in Limekilns. By researching this Wilson family, we have a family history and profile which, although at this time is circumstantial, we believe that we have located the correct David Wilson.

Whilst we have no sure link that the Hummersea engineer is our targeted David Wilson, the following data makes it a very high probability.

David Wilson, born 11 - 4 - 1888 in Limekilns, is the son of William Wilson who at the time of his own marriage in 1881 was an "engineer onboard ship". Thus David being the eldest son is quite likely to following in his father's footsteps. Father William Wilson continued to work as an engineering fitter albeit not at sea.

At the time of Census 1911, when he would be 22 years old, David is not listed under Limekilns, but his parents and twin brother James, a joiner, are still living at Halkettshall, Limekilns. David is assumed to be at sea at the time. Other Census investigations for David Wilson were inconclusive.

By 30 - 12 - 1916, as recorded by the Commonwealth War Graves Commission for the loss of the Hummersea, David Wilson would be 28 years of age, and a suitable age for a second or chief engineer.

David Wilson's parents William Wilson and Christina Bryce continued to live in Limekilns until their deaths in 1928 and 1933 respectively, and they would have the input for his inclusion on the war memorial which was unveiled in 19???????.

Based on the above assumptions, the following descriptions and documents have been compiled. It still needs one piece of evidence to prove conclusively that our David Wilson did go to sea as an engineer.

The required evidence has since been located at the National Archives under Registry of Shipping & Seamen:- Agreements & Crew Lists; Reference:- BT 99/3099/20

This information is filed under the ship's official number, and includes details of only three of the 28 crew members:-

Ship: Hummersea; Official number: 98789.

David Wilson; rank/rating, 2nd Engineer; age, 27;

Place of birth, Dunfermline; previous ship, first.

This has David Wislon, with the correct age and place of birth, so we can now conclude we have located the correct man and his fate.





Historical Information

Buissy was reached by the Third Army on 2 September 1918, after the storming of the Drocourt-Queant line, and it was evacuated by the Germans on the following day.

Queant Cemetery was made by the 2nd and 57th Casualty Clearing Stations in October and November 1918. It then consisted of 71 graves (now Plot I, Rows A and B), but was greatly enlarged after the Armistice when 2200 graves were brought in from the battlefields of 1917-1918 between Arras and Bapaume, and from the following smaller burial grounds in the area:-

BARALLE COMMUNAL CEMETERY BRITISH EXTENSION, which was made in September 1918, contained the graves of 25 soldiers from the United Kingdom; and the GERMAN EXTENSION, from which two graves were brought.

CAGNICOURT COMMUNAL CEMETERY, contained the grave of one soldier from the United Kingdom who fell in September 1918.

LAGNICOURT (6th JAEGER REGIMENT) GERMAN CEMETERY, East of the village, contained 137 German graves and one British.

NOREUIL BRITISH CEMETERIES No.1 and No.2. These were close together, about 400 metres North of Noreuil village. They were made in April-August 1917, and they contained the graves of 50 soldiers from Australia and 16 from the United Kingdom (some of these were re-buried in H.A.C. Cemetery, Ecoust-St. Mein).

NOREUIL GERMAN CEMETERY No.1, next to Noreuil Australian Cemetery, contained 78 German graves and ten British.

PRONVILLE GERMAN CEMETERY "near the Cave", on the Western outskirts of Pronville, contained 17 British graves.

PRONVILLE GERMAN CEMETERY No.4, South of Pronville on the road to Beaumetz, contained 83 German and 83 British graves (52 of the British being those of soldiers of the Black Watch).

PROVILLE CHURCHYARD, contained two British graves.

There are now 2,377 Commonwealth servicemen of the First World War buried or commemorated in this cemetery. 1,441 of the burials are unidentified, but there are special memorials to 56 casualties known or believed to be buried among them. Other special memorials commemorate 26 casualties buried in German cemeteries in the neighbourhood, whose graves could not be found on concentration.

The cemetery was designed by Sir Edwin Lutyens.



The cemetery was begun in June 1917 when a numbers of graves of April and May were brought in from the battlefield It was used until March 1918 and two further burials were made in October 1918. In addition to the 9th and 51st Division, the 15th (Scottish) Division fought in the area, and over half the graves are those of soldiers of Scottish regiments.

Level Crossing Cemetery contains 405 burials and commemorations of the First World War. 29 of the burials are unidentified and a special memorial commemorates one casualty believed to be buried in this cemetery.



Robert McLaren

Born in Limekilns of 15th August 1878, the son of Robert McLaren, a ship's captain who is buried in the old cemetery at Limekilns, and Janet Wilson.

Janet Wilson was the second wife of Robert McLaren. Robert had two sisters, Mary (born c1876) and Isabella (born c1872).

Robert McLaren is described in the Census 1891 as a 'scholar' but he didn't appear again in the local census, either because he had moved from the area or perhaps he followed his father's occupation and was at sea at the time. Either way we have no knowledge of what occupation he followed after school.

We do know that he was pre-deceased by sister Isabella who died aged 29 on 27th December 1901; his father who died 20th MArch 1904; and his mother who died on 25th February 1913.

The whereabouts of his sister Mary after Census 1891 is unknown, so she may be deceased of has left the area, or married.

Robert McLAren joined the Royal Scots (Lothian Regiment) 9th Battalion and rose to the position of Lance-Sergeant. He was killed in action on 23rd April 1917.

Fampoux village in the Pas de Calais, France, was taken on 9th April 1917. It remained behind allied lines after that. He is buried in the Level Crossing Cemetery at Fampoux (grave no: I.B.15). The cemetery was begun in June 1917 when a number of graves of April and May were brought in from the battlefield.

Further information on the 2nd Argylls in Malaya

The following information was given to me by Sandy Blackett, who works for the Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders Museum in Stirling Castle:

The 2nd Battalion Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders was a regular battalion. They fought in the withdrawal through Malaya to Singapore and in the fighting there. Incidentally, that battalion was one of the few Allied units to offer real resistance to the Japanese. The commanding officer, unlike the majority of commanders then in Singapore, had appreciated that the Japanese were likely to advance on Singapore by land from the north, rather than following a sea landing on Singapore Island. He trained his battalion to operate in jungle. Consequently, that battalion formed 12th Indian Brigade's rear guard throughout the withdrawal, forcing the Japanese repeatedly to deploy to attack recently vacated Argyll positions upon which he called artillery fire timed for effect as the Japanese achieved each objective.

I do not know what specifically the battalion was doing on 12 January 1942, but, according to a book I hold (*Why Singapore Fell* by Lt Gen Gordon Bennett, commander of the Australian Imperial Force in Malaya), at that stage of the withdrawal, the 12th Indian Brigade was in the area of Kuala Lumpur - Port Dickson. Bennett's book, naturally, concentrates on the Australian part in the operation, and, although repeatedly most favourably mentioning the Argylls, it does not focus on the detail of their part. He reports that by the time they reached Singapore 'the battalion of The Argyll and Sutherland Highlanders, 800 to 900 strong at the outset, could muster little more than 100 men when the island was reached.'
